Ban Plastics and say No to Plastics, only then the Ecosystem can be saved from the plastic accumulation. Everywhere plastic polythene bags are accumulating on land, in water bodies and even in the stomach of animals. Polythene bags are mainly used in carrying food items and groceries, so if this practice of using plastic bags is banned then it will reduce plastic pollution burden on the environment. The members of LENVIN took initiative to ban plastics and they organised a social outreach program by distributing eco-friendly bags to the public on 21 st September 2019. They made Eco Friendly cloth bags by stitching it. These bags were distributed to the public so that they forbid the use of plastic bags. The public appreciated this initiative and readily accepted the cloth bags.
