CODE OF CONDUCT POLICY FOR STUDENTS

Preface

Code of conduct for students serves as a guide to outline expectations and standards of behavior for all students enrolled at LFDC. It reflects a collective commitment to creating a campus culture characterized by ethical behavior, responsibility and inclusivity. By adhering to the standards outlined in this code of conduct we have created a community where every student feels valued, respected and supported in their academics and personal pursuits.

1. Scope

The code of conduct policy for students in college serves as a comprehensive framework to guide the behavior and actions of students within the academic community. The various dimensions that constitute the scope of this policy are

1.1 Academic integrity:

- a. Upholding academic honesty and integrity in all aspects of learning including examination, assignment and research.
- b. Prohibiting plagiarism and fabrication.
- c. Outlining the consequences of academic dishonesty and the procedure for addressing such violations

1.2 Behavioral expectations:

- a. Establishing standards of behavior that promotes respect and civility among students and towards faculty and staff.
- b. Prohibiting disruptive behavior, harassment, bullying or any form of intimidation irrespective of caste, creed and economic and social status.
- c. Defining appropriate conduct in classrooms, common areas and campus events.

1.3 Use of college facilities and resources:

- a. Setting guidelines for responsible use of college facilities, equipment and resources.
- b. Regulating the use of technology internet access and digital resources in alignment with college policies.
- c. Ensuring the protection and preservation of college property and infrastructure.
- d. Maintaining privacy and academic integrity in the campus.

1.4 Alcohol and substance abuse:

- a. Implementing policies to prevent the possession, use, distribution of illegal drugs, alcohol and smoking on campus.
- b. Establishing disciplinary measures for violations related to alcohol and substance abuse.

1.5 Community engagement and citizenship:

- a. Encourage active participation in campus activities such as cells, Committees and clubs.
- b. Promoting responsible citizenship and community engagement through extension activities.

1.6 Reporting and accountability:

- a. Outlining procedures for violation of code of conduct
- b. Ensure confidentiality and protection for individuals, reporting misconduct or seeking support.
- c. Holding students accountable for their actions through fair and disciplinary processes.

1.7 Disciplinary Measures:

- a. Varies depending on the severity of the violation of the code of conduct. It includes warnings, suspensions, expulsions or other actions deemed appropriate by the authority in charge.
- b. Students can be referred to the counselling center to understand the consequences of any misconduct.

2. Objectives

2.1 Promoting academic integrity:

- a. Ensure students understand and adhere to principles of honesty and integrity in academic pursuits
- b. Encourage a culture of originality and critical thinking

2.2 Fostering respectful behavior:

- a. Cultivate an environment where all students are treated with dignity and respect.
- b. Prohibit harassment and ragging that undermines the wellbeing of others.
- c. Encourage tolerance, empathy and understanding among students from diverse backgrounds.

2.3 Maintaining a Safe environment:

- a. Establish guidelines for appropriate conduct to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the students.
- b. Provide protocols for emergency situations and promote awareness of campus safety resources.

2.4 Promoting personal growth and development:

- a. Support the academic development of students by promoting interpersonal skills
- b. Provide opportunity for leadership development conflict resolution and decision making.
- c. Creating a supportive environment where students can thrive academically socially and personally

3. Composition

4. Process

- The committee holds meetings to discuss the objectives of the code of conduct ensuring it aligns with the college mission and values.
- Key areas that the code of conduct should address academic integrity, behavioral expectations, use of college facilities and clearly define prohibited behaviors, violations and potential consequences.
- Educational components such as awareness programs on training to promote ethical behavior and prevent violations.
- Consider the needs of a diverse student community and ensure the code is inclusive and culturally sensitive.
- Propagate/Distribute the code of conduct widely using various channels like college website, student handbook, orientation sessions.
- Establish reporting mechanisms and procedures for alleged violations.

5. Rules and Regulations

5.1 Attendance

• The college gives importance to regular attendance and insists for 75% attendance as per Osmania University guidelines to be eligible for semester examination.

5.2 Punctuality

• Students should arrive on time to college and they should notify their class in charge in advance if unable to attend the college on time or due to unforeseen circumstances.

5.3 Uniform

• Students should adhere to the college dress code policy

5.4 Valuables

• Students are instructed not to bring valuables to the college and any if loss of valuables, the college is not responsible.

5.5 Ragging

• Treat fellow students with respect and consideration, any misconduct will not be tolerated and will lead to disciplinary action

5.6 Discipline

- Courtesy in speech and conduct must be maintained at all times.
- Students are expected to treat faculty and staff with due respect and avoid disruptive behavior that hinders the learning process
- Respect college property and refrain from vandalism, theft or any other form of property damage.
- To remain focused on the learning environment shooting videos/recording with prior permission.
- Students are strictly forbidden from being influenced by external elements affecting the normal function of the institution.
- Students indulging in serious misconduct detrimental to the discipline and reputation of the college shall be expelled from the college.

5.7 Parking

- The students are instructed to have a valid parking ID from college administration.
- The students are required to provide necessary documentation with regard to their vehicle.
- Students should park their vehicles only in designated parking areas.
