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
1. Annual Department Conference (OU) UG General English and ML Syllabus

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
5. Conducted: Writing Activity HAIKU

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
9. Conducted: Vigilance Awareness Week Essay Writing – Integrity – A Way of Life

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
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13. Conducted: Workshop Content Writing
