



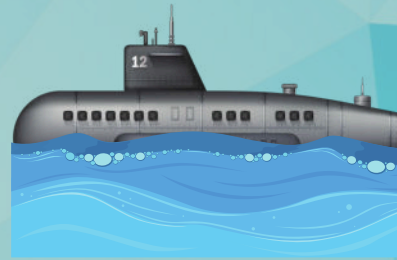

International Women's Day Celebrations (2024-2025)

Report on Week-Long International Women's Day Celebrations

Theme: Empowering Women Through Health, Skills, and Awareness

In celebration of International Women's Day, the Women's Cell of Little Flower Degree College organized a week-long series of events from 3rd to 8th March 2024. THE ORIGIN OF APRIL FOOLS' DAY: A MYSTERY WRAPPED IN LAUGHTER

April 1st is widely recognized as April Fools' Day, a day dedicated to playing harmless pranks and jokes on friends, family, and even strangers. But how did this tradition of trickery begin? Surprisingly, the exact origins of April Fools' Day remain uncertain, with several intriguing theories offering possible explanations.

The Calendar Change Theory

One of the most popular theories dates back to 16th-century France. Before 1582, many parts of Europe, including France, followed the Julian calendar, which celebrated the New Year around the end of March or early April. However, in 1582, Pope Gregory XIII introduced the Gregorian calendar, shifting New Year's Day to January 1.

Since communication was slow in those days, many people either failed to hear about the change or refused to accept it. Those who continued celebrating the old New Year in April were ridiculed and called "April fools." Over time, this practice of mocking people evolved into an annual tradition of playing pranks.

Roman and Medieval Festivals

Some historians believe April Fools' Day has even older roots, tracing back to ancient Roman and medieval festivals. The Roman festival of Hilaria, celebrated around March 25, involved people dressing in disguises, mocking public officials, and engaging in playful mischief. Similarly, the medieval Feast of Fools, which took place in late December, encouraged people to engage in role reversals and humorous acts, much like modern April Fools' pranks.

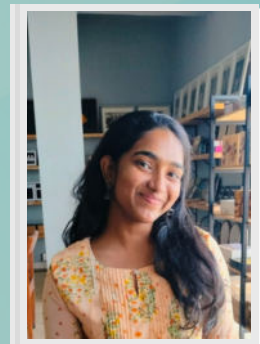
The "Fool's Errand" in England and Scotland

By the 18th century, April Fools' Day had spread across Britain, where it became a popular tradition. Scotland even extended the celebration to two days, with the second day called "Tailie Day," during which people played pranks involving the backside—such as pinning paper tails or "kick me" signs on unsuspecting victims.

Modern-Day Celebrations

Today, April Fools' Day is celebrated worldwide, with media outlets, companies, and individuals taking part in elaborate hoaxes. Some famous pranks include the BBC's 1957 "Spaghetti Tree" hoax, where viewers were tricked into believing spaghetti grew on trees, and Google's creative April 1st announcements, which often feature playful fake products.

While its exact origins remain a mystery, April Fools' Day continues to bring joy and laughter, reminding us not to take life too seriously—at least for one day a year.

World Health Day, celebrated annually on April 7th, marks the founding of the World Health Organization (WHO) in 1948. Since 1950, it has served as a global platform to highlight key health issues. This year's theme, "Healthy Beginnings, Hopeful Futures," focuses on maternal and newborn health, urging governments and health communities to prioritize women's well-being.

In 1948, WHO held the First World Health Assembly, which decided to celebrate April 7th each year as World Health Day to raise awareness of major global health issues. The WHO organizes events at international, regional, and local levels, while governments, NQOs, and media use this day to promote public health initiatives.

World Health Day is one of 11 official global health campaigns by WHO, alongside World Tuberculosis Day, World Immunization Week, World Malaria Day, World No Tobacco Day, World AIDS Day, World Blood Donor Day, World Chagas Disease Day, World Patient Safety Day, World Antimicrobial Awareness Week, and World Hepatitis Day.

Why It Matters

Maternal and newborn health remains a global concern. Based on current estimates:

- 300,000 women die annually due to pregnancy or childbirth complications.
- Over 2 million newborns die within their first month of life.
- Around 2 million more are stillborn.

At the current rate, 4 out of 5 countries are off track to meet maternal survival targets by 2030, and 1 in 3 will fail to reduce newborn deaths. This means one preventable death occurs every 7 seconds.

Campaign Goals

- Raise awareness about maternal and newborn health challenges.
- Advocate for investments in healthcare to improve survival rates.
- Encourage collective action to support parents and healthcare professionals.
- Provide essential health information about pregnancy, childbirth, and postnatal care.

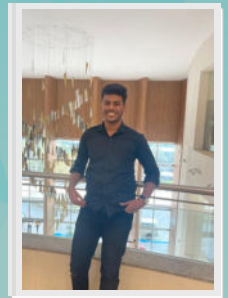

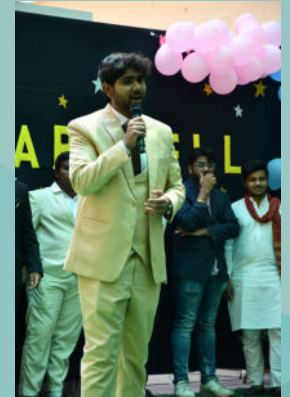
ANNUAL DAY CELEBRATIONS
