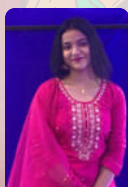

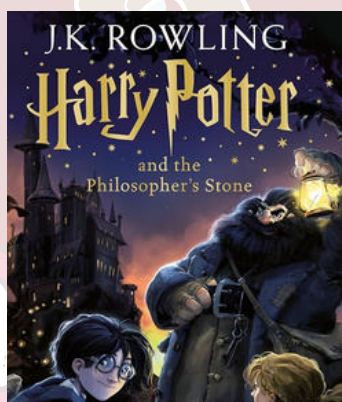
The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe - Movie Review

The Big Friendly Giant - Movie Review

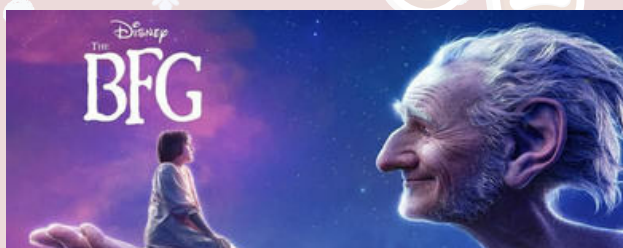

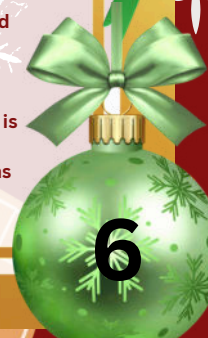
Harry Potten and the Philosopher's Stone - Book Review

Human Rights Day

Human Rights Day (HRD) is celebrated annually around the world on 10 December every year. The date was chosen to honor the United Nations General Assembly's adoption and proclamation, on 10 December 1948, of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), the first global enunciation of human rights and one of the first major achievements of the new United Nations. The formal establishment of Human Rights Day occurred at the 317th Plenary Meeting of the General Assembly on 4 December 1950, when the General Assembly declared resolution 423(V), inviting all member states and any other interested organizations to celebrate the day as they saw fit. The day is normally marked both by high-level political conferences and meetings and by cultural events and exhibitions dealing with human rights issues. Besides, it is traditionally on 10 December that the five-yearly United Nations Prize in the Field of Human Rights and Nobel Peace Prize are awarded. Many governmental and non-governmental organizations active in the human rights field also schedule special events to commemorate the day, as do many civil and social-cause organisations. The High Commissioner for Human Rights, as the main United Nations rights official, and the Office of the High Commissioner play a major role in coordinating efforts for the yearly observation of Human Rights Day.

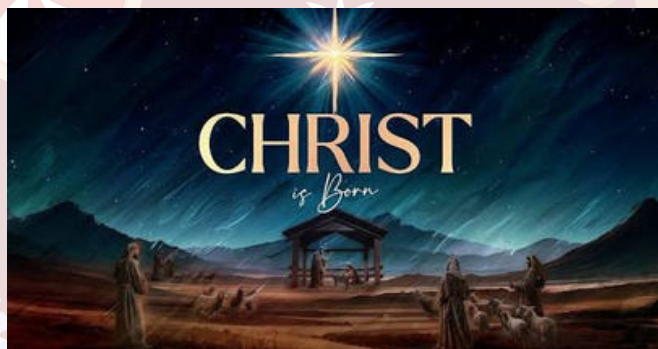

Por Thozhil is a gripping, no-nonsense Tamil crime thriller that keeps you on the edge of your seat from start to finish. The story follows rookie DSP Prakash and veteran cop SP Loganathan as they chase a cunning serial killer targeting young women.

What sets the film apart is its taut screenplay and raw intensity —no songs, no fluff, just pure thriller. Ashok Selvan impresses as the determined rookie, while Sarath Kumar anchors the film with a seasoned, grounded performance. The movie also subtly explores darker societal themes, adding emotional depth beneath the suspense.

Some twists feel slightly convenient, and the psychological aspects could have been explored more, but these are minor compared to the overall impact.
