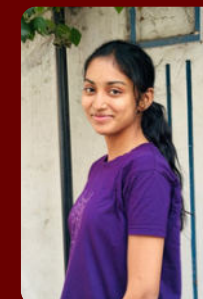

Because it's the perfect mix of hostel humor, relatable struggles, and "oh-no-they-didn't" moments.

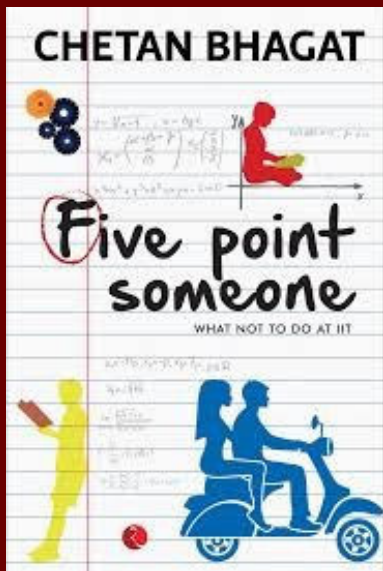
WHY SKIP IT?

World Animal Day

World Animal Day is an international day of action for animal rights and welfare celebrated annually on October 4, the feast day of Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of animals. The World Animal Day movement is supported and endorsed by a number of celebrities, such as Anneka Svenska, Brian Blessed, and Melanie C. World Animal Day was originated by cynologist Heinrich Zimmermann. He organized the first World Animal Day on March 24, 1925, at the Sport Palace in Berlin, Germany. Over 5,000 people attended this first event. The activity was originally scheduled for October 4, to align with the feast day of Saint Francis of Assisi, patron saint of animals. However, the venue was not available on that day. The event was then moved to October 4 for the first time in 1929. Every year, Zimmermann worked tirelessly on the promotion of World Animal Day. Finally, in May 1931 at a congress of the International Animal Protection Congress in Florence, Italy, his proposal to make October 4 as World Animal Day universal was unanimously accepted and adopted as a resolution. It is sometimes cited, incorrectly, that World Animal Day started in 1931 at the convention of ecologists in Florence, Italy, who wished to highlight the plight of endangered species. Since 2003, World Animal Day has been coordinated by the UK-based animal welfare charity Naturewatch Foundation, with a new World Animal Day website launched for the 2023 celebration.

Many countries, such as Bolivia, the Bahamas, China, and Colombia, have community-driven annual events to promote the global celebrations.

In conclusion, World Animal Day exists to raise the status of animals and improve welfare standards around the globe.

It's a day of celebration for animal lovers like you and me everywhere.

It is our chance to mobilize into a global force, to take action against animal cruelty, neglect, and unfair treatment, and to make the world a better place for all animals.

International Coffee Day

International Coffee Day (1 October) is an occasion that is used to promote and celebrate coffee as a beverage, with events now occurring in places around the world. The first official date was 3 October 2015, as agreed by the then International Coffee Organization, and it was launched in Milan. This day is also used to promote fair trade coffee and to raise awareness for the plight of the coffee growers. On this day, many businesses offer free or discounted cups of coffee. Some businesses share coupons and special deals with their loyal followers via social networking. Some greeting card companies sell International Coffee Day greeting cards as well as free e-cards. Many countries around the world celebrate their own national coffee days at various dates throughout the year. In March 2014, the Member States of the ICO (International Coffee Organization) agreed to organize International Coffee Day on 1 October to create a single day of celebration for coffee lovers around the world.

The exact origin of International Coffee Day is unknown. The event was first promoted in Japan in 1983 by the All Japan Coffee Association. In the United States "National Coffee Day" was mentioned publicly as early as 2005. The name "International Coffee Day" was first used by the Southern Food and Beverage Museum, which called a press conference on 3 October 2009 to celebrate it and to announce the first New Orleans Coffee Festival. It was promoted in China by the International Coffee Organization, first celebrated in 1997, and made into an annual celebration in early April 2001. Taiwan first celebrated International Coffee Day in 2009. Nepal first celebrated National Coffee Day on 17 November 2005.

Significance:

***Cultural and Economic Importance:** Coffee is a globally beloved beverage with deep cultural roots and significant economic impact, providing livelihoods for millions.

Raising Awareness: International Coffee Day shines a light on the challenges faced by coffee farmers, including low prices and environmental issues like climate change and deforestation.

***Promoting Fair Trade:** The day advocates for fair wages, sustainable farming practices, and ethical labor conditions in the coffee industry.

Enjoying the Beverage: It's a chance for coffee lovers to savor their favorite brews, explore different varieties, and perhaps even try new coffee-based drinks and dishes.

Nestled in the misty mountains of Mussoorie lives a man whose words have painted India's hills in the hearts of millions—Ruskin Bond. With his warm, unpretentious style, Bond has been India's beloved storyteller for over six decades.

Born in 1934 in Kasauli, Himachal Pradesh, Bond grew up surrounded by nature's beauty—lush hills, whispering pines, and monsoon rains. These landscapes became the soul of his writing. At just 17, he penned *The Room on the Roof*, a novel inspired by his own life in Dehradun, winning the John Llewellyn Rhys Prize.

Literature – The Mirror and the Window

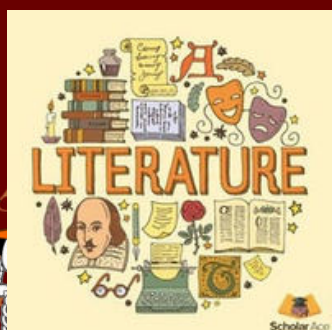
Literature is more than ink on paper – it is both a mirror, reflecting the world as it is, and a window, opening onto worlds we have never known.

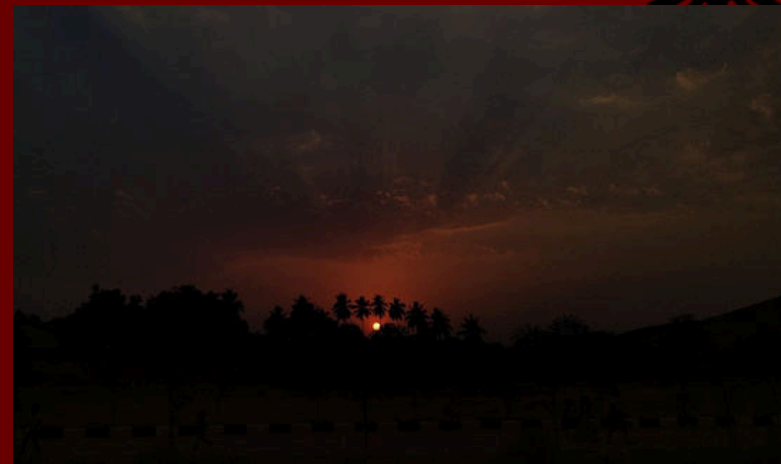

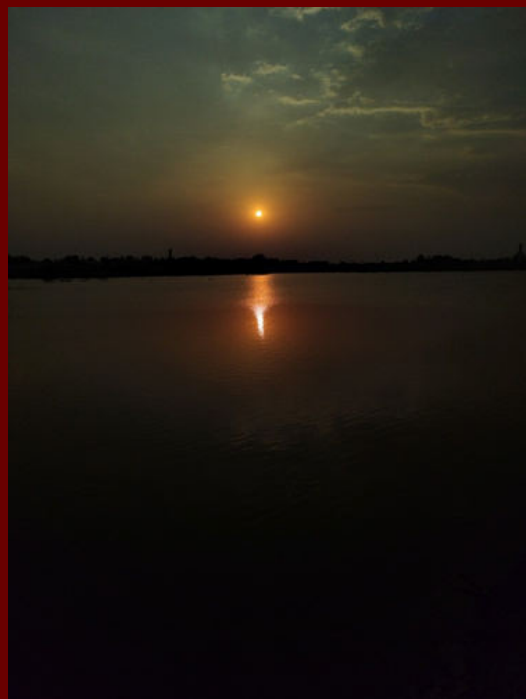

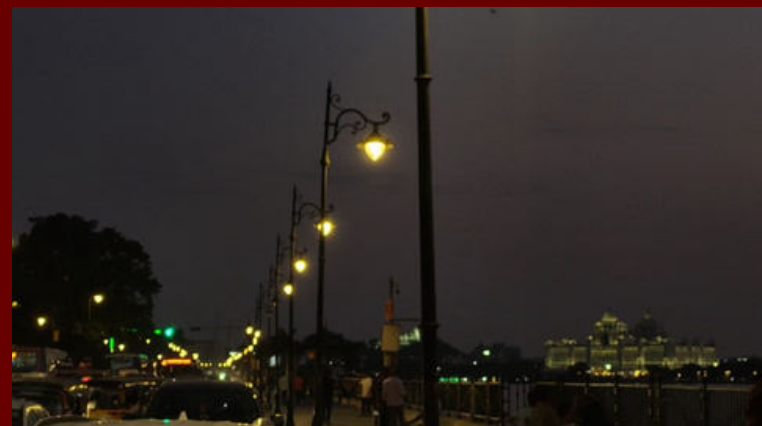
