

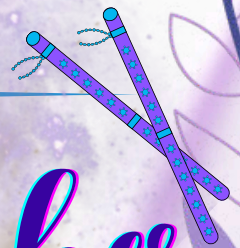
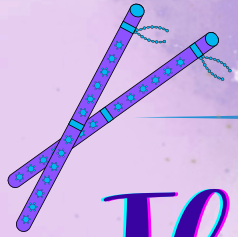

Book Review: *The 3 Mistakes of My Life* by Chetan Bhagat

Rating: ★★★★★☆ (4/5)

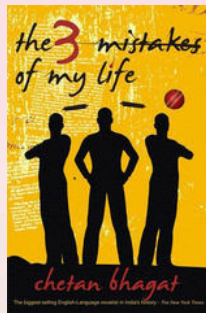
Chetan Bhagat's *The 3 Mistakes of My Life* is a fast-paced and emotional story set in the vibrant city of Ahmedabad, India. Genre: Sci-Fi / Drama / Adventure

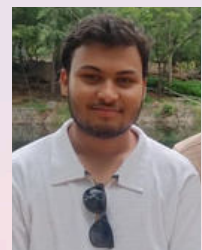

Leo Tolstoy

Leo Tolstoy born August 28 1828, Yasnaya Polyana, Tula province, Russian Empire—died November 7 1910, Astapovo, Ryazan province) was a Russian author, a master of realistic fiction, and one of the world's greatest novelists. He is best known for his two longest works, *War and Peace* (1865–69) and *Anna Karenina* (1875–77), which are commonly regarded as among the finest novels ever written. *War and Peace* in particular virtually defines this form for many readers and critics. Among Tolstoy's shorter works, *The Death of Ivan Ilyich* (1886) is usually classed among the best examples of the novella

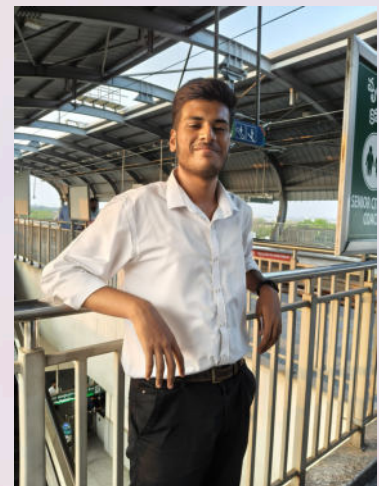
Especially during his last three decades Tolstoy also achieved world renown as a moral and religious teacher. His doctrine of nonresistance to evil had an important influence on the Indian independence leader Mahatma Gandhi. Although Tolstoy's religious ideas no longer command the respect they once did, interest in his life and personality has, if anything, increased over the years

Legacy of Leo Tolstoy

In contrast to other psychological writers, such as Dostoyevsky, who specialized in unconscious processes, Tolstoy described conscious mental life with unparalleled mastery. His name has become synonymous with an appreciation of contingency and of the value of everyday activity. Oscillating between skepticism and dogmatism, Tolstoy explored the most-diverse approaches to human experience. Above all, his greatest works, *War and Peace* and *Anna Karenina*, endure as the summit of realist fiction.

Horizon Club Visit to Our Sacred Space

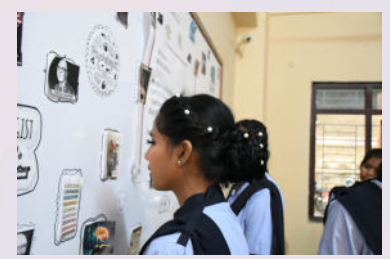

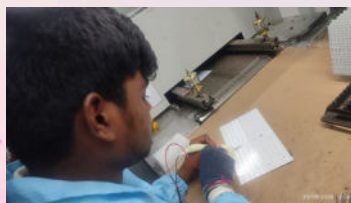
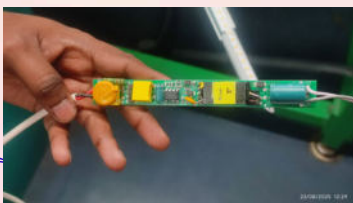
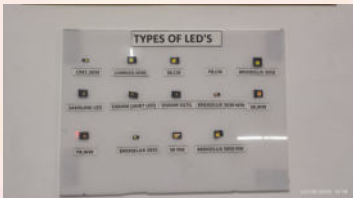
Self-Defence Training Session
