- **Messi's "GOAT India Tour":**

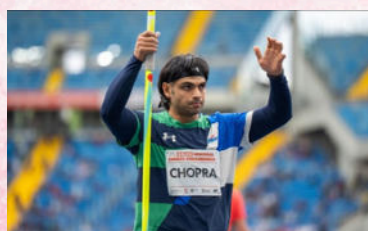
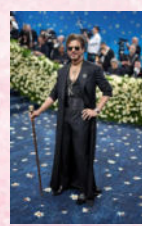

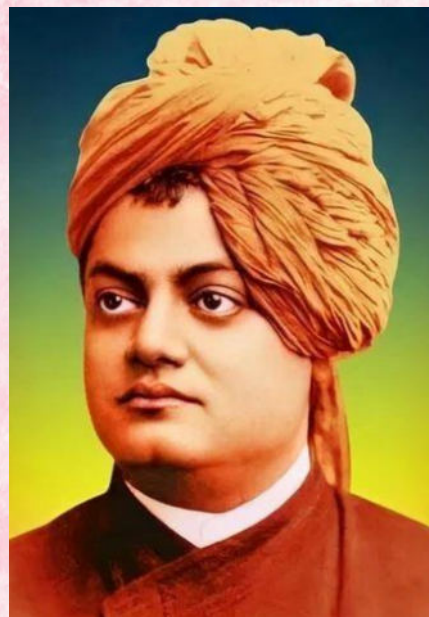

Why It's a Great Watch for Students

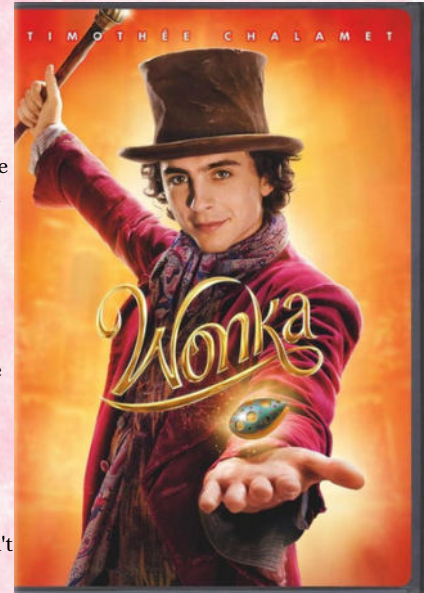

Birth Anniversary of Subhash Chandra Bose

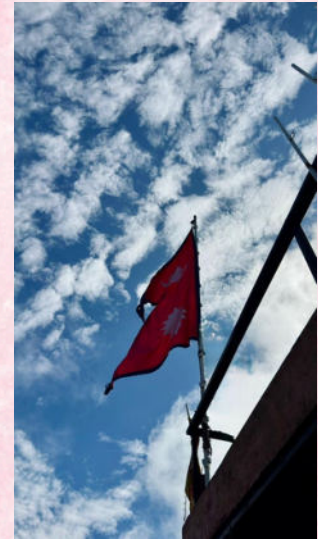


Pre Christmas Celebration

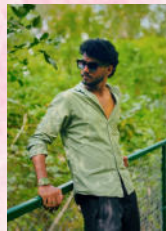

Tridha Organics offers a popular strawberry picking experience near Secunderabad, requiring advance online booking for entry (around ₹250/person) and letting you purchase picked berries (around ₹800/kg), available seasonally (typically Dec-March), providing a fun family farm activity with organic principles.

- **Key Details:**
- **Location:** Kundanpally Village, near Hattrick cricket ground, Secunderabad.
- **Booking:** Mandatory online booking; walk-ins are not allowed.
- **Entry Fee:** Around ₹250 per person (children under 2 free).
- **Strawberry Price:** Around ₹800 per kg (you pay for what you pick).
- **Season:** Generally runs from December/January until March.
- **What to Expect:** A family-friendly farm experience, picking fresh strawberries directly from the soil, with organic farming practices.
