



#### FIELD TRIP TO INSTITUTE OF MENTAL HEALTH - ERRAGADDA

OBJECTIVE The Department of Psychology conducted a field trip to IMH on 20 April, 2023. The field trip was conducted from 9.00 am to 2:30 pm. 50 Students of M.A & BA Psychology of all years took an active part in the field trip.

The objective of the field trip was to give practical exposure to various psychological disturbances which they study as part of their curriculum

Field trip was taken place for the students of Post Graduation and undergraduation to make them understand and practically experience their role in the future. Trip was planned on 20/04/2023, with 50 students and faculty (3) from the Psychology department. Students were taken to IMH, Erragadda, hyd. Reached the institution by 09:am. After reaching the institution, clinical psychologist Venkata Subbaiah addressed students and given instructions about student's behavior and safety measures while attending the patient, from there students were taken to outpatient wards, where students could interact with family members of patients, who are suffering with various mental illnesses like, Mood disorders, Schizophrenia, Anxiety and Depression. Students noted down the symptoms, severity and causes of the cases that they have observed.

There were nearly more than 600 patients in the institute both inpatient and

outpatient. The students were also taken to in-patient open wards of both males and females where special cases like paranoid schizophrenia, bipolar disorders related people were admitted for inhouse treatment.

Outcome: The students learned many things about the treatment procedures, how important a clinical psychologist is for the institute, about causes of mental illnesses.

The students feedback would be positive, given the engaging content of the Field Trip. They likely appreciated the insights about the clinical methods to determine the illness, importance and scope of clinical psychologists, also types of treatments, interventions and assessments used.




Fig 1: Soumya G of BA 1 participating in the event.
